## DEEPENING OUR AWARENESS - SOMETHING TO PONDER



### SEEKING THE ONE WHO HAS ALREADY FOUND US\* A Reflection by Gerald G. May, MD

Scripture says that God is endlessly involved in active, intimate love with us. ... If God is indeed so closely involved with our lives, more intimate than a mother with her unborn child, the idea of "seeking" God seems paradoxical.

This paradox is echoed and refined in the words of the great contemplatives. They say that spiritual formation, the process of deepening our conscious, responsive relationship with God, is really the work of God within us. It is already happening; it has been since before we were born, and nothing will stop it. Yet it also involves our willingness, our consent. In the freedom of our choosing, we say Yes to a relationship that already exists, and we join in its process of deepening. ...

We are participant co-creators. God will be active within us irrevocably, but we bring immeasurable beauty to that process when we affirm it, choose it, and actively join in it. Spiritual formation, the deepening of love in life, is very different from learning a subject, mastering a task, or behaving in correct ways. It is not a matter of achievement or of "getting it right." The spiritual life is a movement of love and light, and there is no success and no failure here.

So how do we go about searching for the One who is already with us? I am convinced that the most important thing we can do is simply to claim our care, to feel our desire. In the process of caring, we can seek some appreciation of how God is already happening within us. What has been going on all along, beneath our resistances and compulsions? What are the simple ways in which we most naturally experience love and truth and light? What is there already within us that we can most deeply affirm and appreciate? Then, with our eyes on this light instead of on our self-judged deficiencies and failures, we can follow God's lead toward growing fulfillment of the two great commandments. ...

It is God's work, God's labor of love that we join. It is God's always-given gift to us that we open our hands to receive. It is God's dance of creation in which we participate. And it is God's already existing presence within us that we seek to realize more fully. For this, the most perfect participation is simply to feel our desire and offer our willingness to God. ... To sense and know our desire is the most beautiful gift we can both receive and give. It is the ground of our loving participation with God, our mirror of God's love for us.
